About the Econ minor:

- Econ 221 and 222 are required courses in the minor
- 24 units of Econ classes are required for the minor including Econ 221 and 222
- 16 units of upper division Econ classes must be taken (300-400 level courses)
- 8 of the units must be 400 level courses
- You can double count classes from your major, GE area, and your concentration
