



# France



Following are some of the opportunities available to you in France:

## OCOB exchange with IFI Rouen

**Language requirement:** none; however, it is recommended that students take a French class

**Cost:** students pay regular Cal Poly fees and expenses; airfare/visa/health insurance/accommodations; no separate "program cost"; students remain eligible for financial aid

**Accommodations:** private room; house/flat; residence hall; assistance provided from IFI

**Courses students have successfully substituted at IFI:** BUS 302, BUS 303, BUS 342, BUS 371, BUS 402, BUS 446, ECON 304

**Timeframe:** semester system (one or two semesters)

**Notes:** Rouen is located about one hour from Paris by train; can be competitive as exchange numbers are limited; students must apply for an exchange spot from the OCOB and then be recommended to IFI

## Cal State International Program (Aix-en-Provence, France and Paris, France)

**Language requirement:** Aix-en-Provence, at least one term of college-level French; Paris, at least two years college French.

**Cost:** students pay regular Cal Poly fees and expenses; airfare/visa/health insurance/housing; all campus financial aid, except work study, is applicable; no separate "program cost."

**Accommodations:** **Aix-en-Provence:** studio apartments, home stays. Home stays available on a limited basis. **Paris:** Students stay in program-arranged housing upon arrival at Cité Universitaire. They can locate permanent housing during orientation. Most students take small studios or shared apartments. Au pair positions are available on a limited basis; assistance provided from IP

**Courses students have successfully substituted:** Contact IP Coordinator, Monica Schechter, in the IEP Office for course substitutions information.

**Timeframe:** one year: middle of August - end of May

**Notes:** Acceptance can be competitive; cumulative GPA of 2.75 required to apply; must be sophomore, upper division, or graduate standing to apply.
