Upper-Division B, Upper-Division C, and Upper-Division D should be taken only after Junior standing is reached (90 units).

Refer to online catalog for GE course selection, United States Cultural Pluralism (USCP) and Graduation Writing Requirement (GWR).

USCP requirement can be satisfied by some (but not all) courses within GE categories: Upper-Division B, C1, Upper-Division C, D1, Upper-Division D, or E.

¹ Students pursuing the Quantitative Analysis concentration should take MATH 141 and MATH 142 instead of just MATH 141.

² Students who take BUS 391 (4 units) must also take BUS 392 (4 units). Choosing BUS 391 & 392 will reduce Free Electives to 4 units (vs 8). Students may also substitute ECON 395 during the junior year for CSC 101 or BUS 391 & 392.

³ Students who choose not to declare a concentration follow the General Curriculum in Economics: Complete at least 8 units 300-400 level ECON coursework plus any 20 units of coursework at 300-400 level.

⁴ Free Elective unit value will be determined by concentration selected.
